A Message from our President

I threw some horrible cups over the last month... and this time I'm keeping all of them!

Looking at my nephew play, I was reminded of how simple it can be to be creative. Giving him a piece of paper and some coloured pencils, he was on his way – making something. When he felt he needed to have a part of his drawing "come out of" the paper, he ripped a piece and folded it. Not being quite pleased with the jagged edges, he asked for scissors or some other tool to cut straight with. He then looked at his creation and decided he needed something to stick the new piece to the paper with. At no point he was inhibited by technical options available, just finding solutions to achieve his next idea.

I decided to spice things up in the studio as I grew old of my usual cups. "Make a cup in a way you never did before and then try to make four of them — and don't throw any of them away." I usually recycle anything I'm not pleased with, but the challenge now was to come up with solutions on how to play with the idea and develop it, and find the tools that could make it happen. I started to play — uninhibited. I made sets of cups, a couple of them ended up as little bowls, some as milk jugs and sugar pots, some as funky plates. Let's see if next month I can find a way to make a horrible cup interesting. I can still grind bits off, use engobes and stains, glaze, ...

In the words of my own pottery teacher, Naomi Verchovsky, at least for now "it's just clay."



Call To Artists: Apply For Artist-in-Residence Program By Nov. 1

The City of Port Coquitlam invites Metro Vancouver artists to apply for the Artist-in-Residence program in 2020-2021. The application deadline is **November 1, 2019.**

The Leigh Square Artist-in-Residence program is a self-directed residency offering artists the opportunity to research, develop, and produce new or ongoing bodies of work with dedicated studio time. The Artist-in-Residence program offers opportunities for artists to work in the community, to develop arts-based engagement activities, and to deliver creative projects that generate meaningful connections. Our residencies are open to artists or artist collectives working in the visual, performance, literary, and musical arts. New in 2020 we are also offering an Eco-arts residency in Lions Park.

The City of Port Coquitlam Artist-in-Residence program does not offer a live-in residency, and takes place in a community centre setting with shared studio resources. Artists interested in the program should live or work in Metro Vancouver, BC, Canada, within reasonable commuting distance from the facilities.


In exchange for studio space, artists facilitate public workshops and outreach programs for the local community as part of their residency. The duration of the residencies vary for the following program terms: February 3 – June 26, 2020; July 22 – November 19, 2020; February 1 – June 25, 2021; Eco-arts residency in Lions Park April 6 – October 5, 2020.

Sasha Wardell is well known for her innovative approach to working with bone china. She uses advanced industrial processes to produce individually crafted objects designed for the contemporary home. She has lectured at numerous art colleges and taught international workshops in France, Belgium and Switzerland. She now divides her time between Britain and the south-west of France. Her talk will highlight the influence of having studied industrial ceramics in both France and the UK.

Wardell received her BA Hons in 3D Design (Ceramics) from the Bath Academy of Art prior to studying industrial ceramics at the École Nationale des Arts Décoratifs in Limoges, France. She later received her MA in Ceramics Design from the North Staffordshire Polytechnic in Stoke-on-Trent. She has lectured in Ceramics at numerous art colleges in the UK, Ireland and Europe and taught international workshops in France, Belgium and Switzerland. In 2011 she was elected to the International Academy of Ceramics in Geneva. She now divides her time between Britain and the south-west of France, making her work and teaching classes in bone china and mould-making.

Her talk, "Tempting Translucency," will present a case history of her career and fascination with bone china from the mid-seventies to the present day. She will highlight the influence of having studied industrial ceramics in both France and the UK.


